
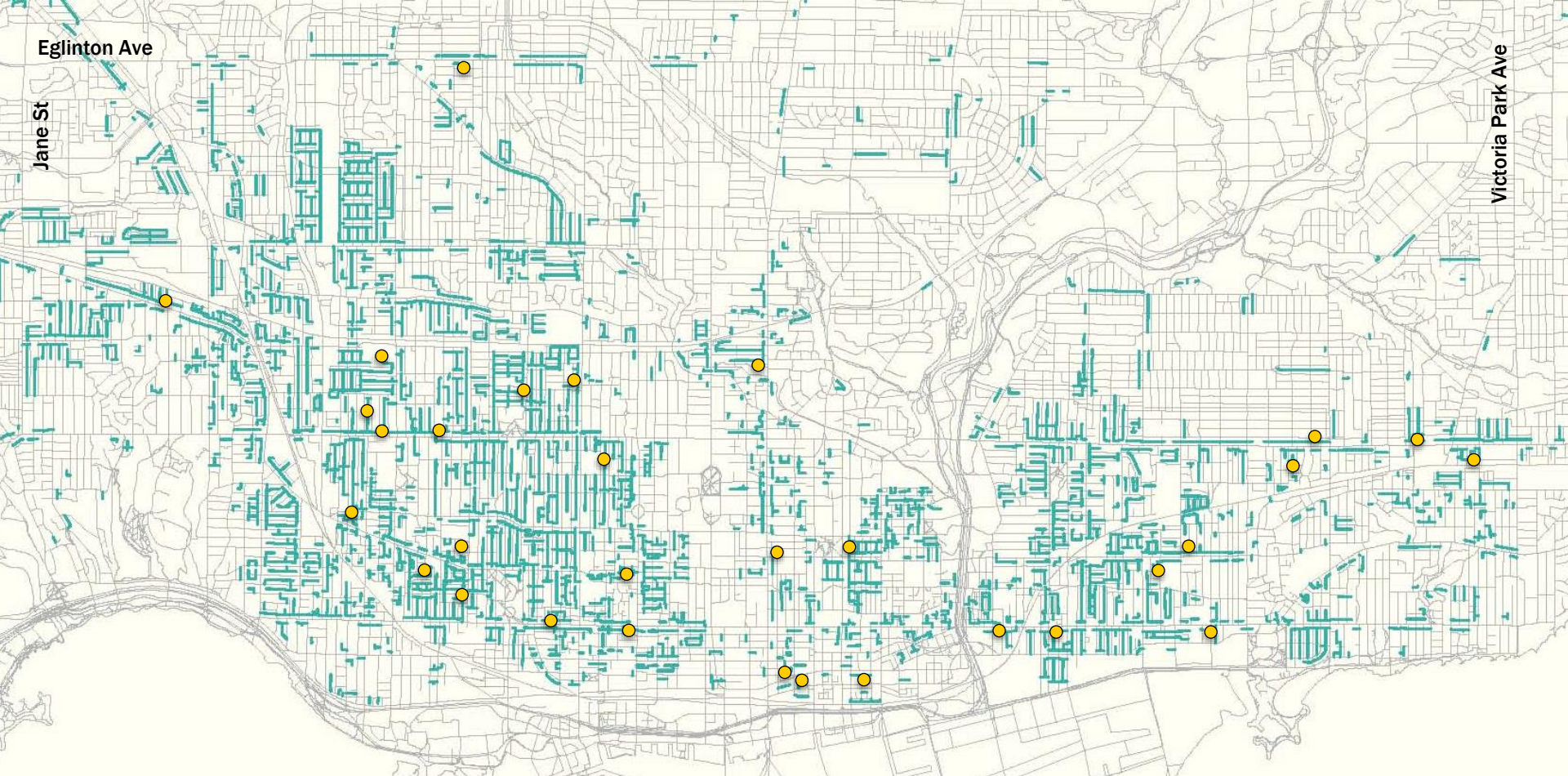




CREATING LANEWAYS THAT WORK

Since 2014 we have worked with public, private and community stakeholders to plan, design, and implement pop-up and permanent laneway improvements in over 30 neighbourhoods throughout Toronto's laneway network; advised municipal staff on the development of laneway-friendly guidelines, policies and plans; and developed free-to-user public planning resources to build capacity in grassroots-level communities.



LANEWAY PARK-ING 2020-21

Since October 2020 we've been working with residents, service organizations, students, residential care providers and businesses in the Garden District and Leslieville to turn two local laneways into vibrant multi-use spaces where deliveries, walking, parking and local culture can coexist. Master planning is complete and installation will take place in Spring 2021.

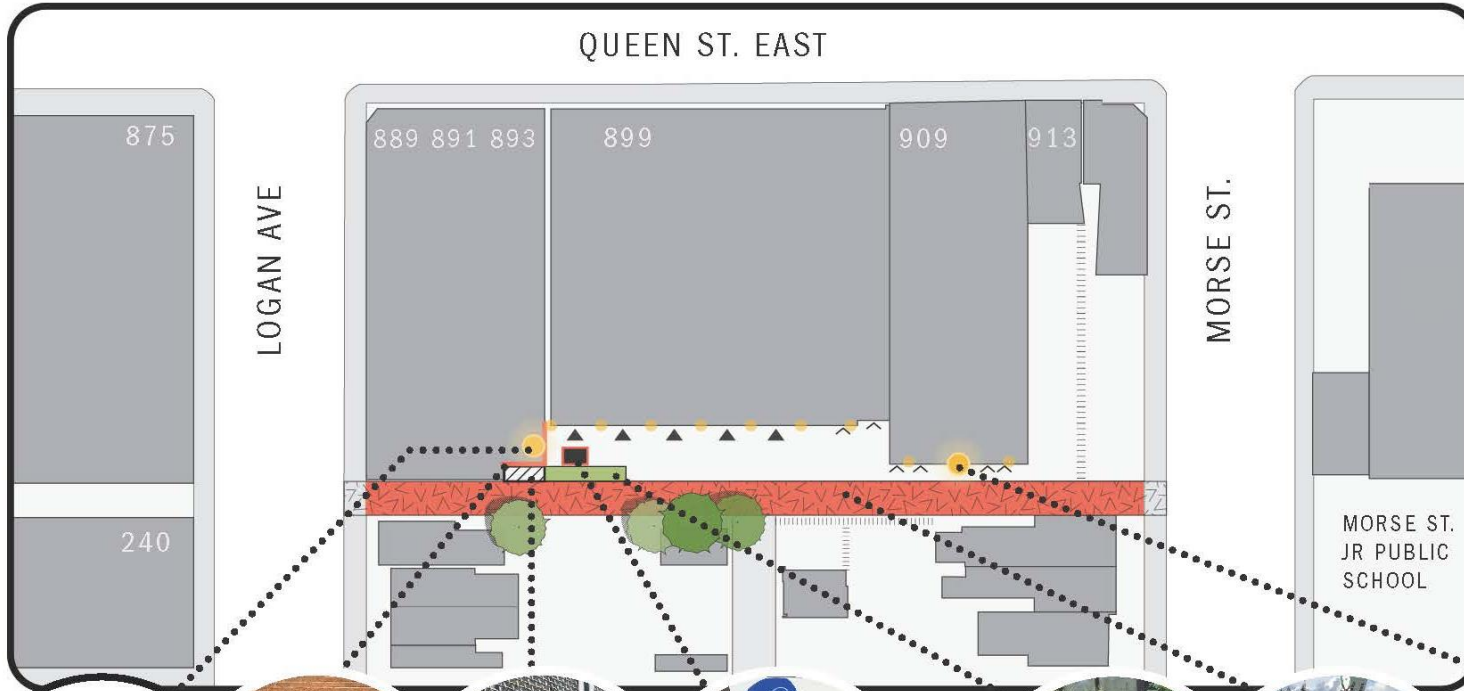

NICHOLSON LANE REVITALIZATION

In 2018-19 we worked with local residents, businesses, cultural organizations and the St. Lawrence Market Neighbourhood BIA to transform this laneway into a welcoming, mixed-mode shared space. Phase 1 included new light poles, building-mounted light fixtures, planter gardens and murals; Phase 2 will see road repairs and resurfacing with two tones of unit paving.

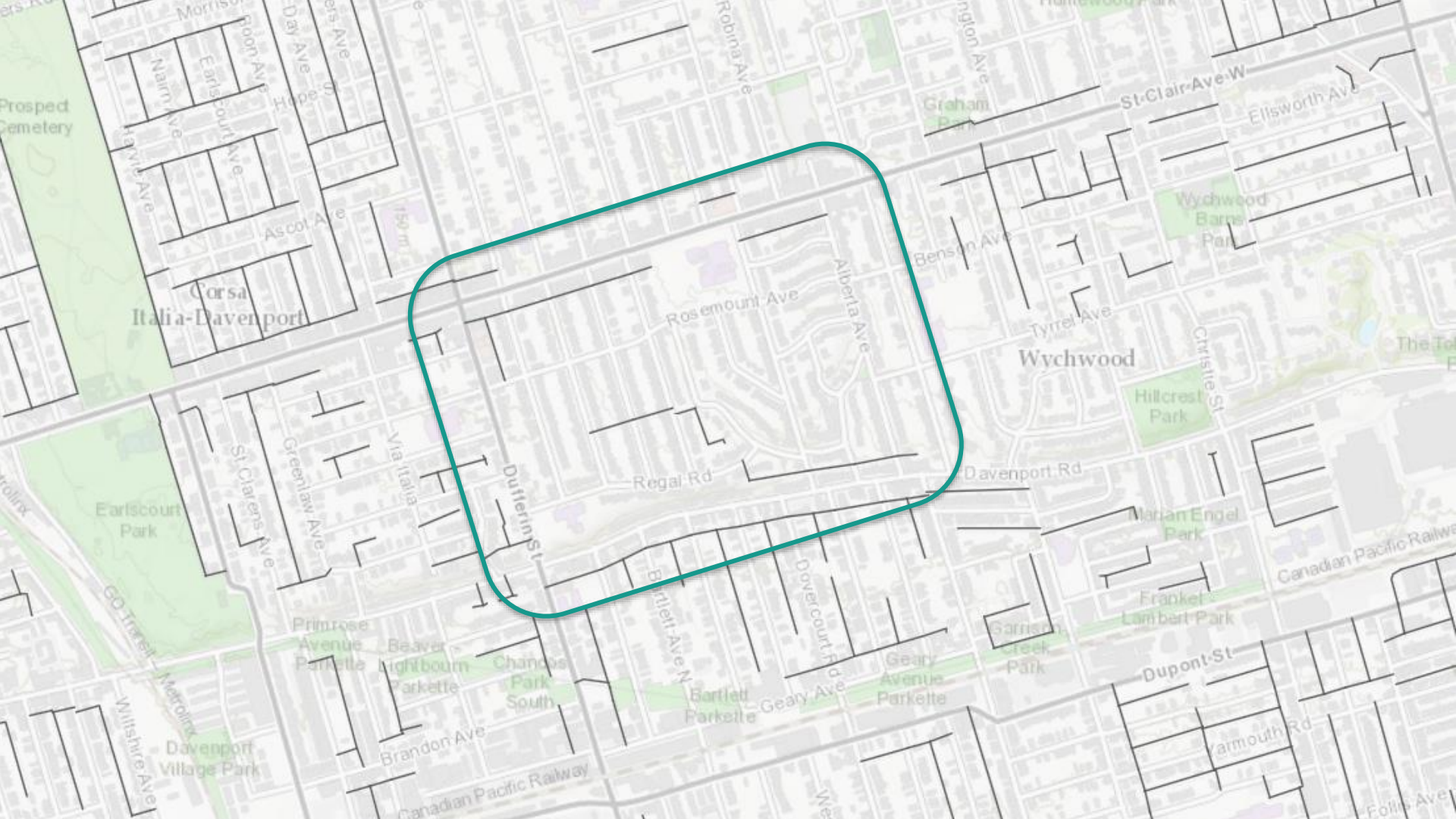




LIGHT UP THE LANEWAYS

In 2018-19 we worked in collaboration with local BIAs and Community Associations in two neighbourhoods - Bloordale and Ossington – to add new light poles, building-mounted light fixtures, wall murals, traffic-calming road murals, and planter gardens to create safe, vibrant and welcoming shared spaces for their communities.





LANEWAY PARK-ING 2021-22

We're working to identify three laneways in different neighbourhoods around the city to be part of the next round of the project, from September 2021 to June 2022.
